In 1868 Rev. Phillips Brooks wrote a Christmas
carol for the Sunday school children in his church.
"O Little Town of Bethlehem" has become one of
the most beloved of all carols. The third verse says,

*How silently, how silently,
The wondrous gift is given;
So God imparts to human hearts
The blessings of His heaven.*

The "wondrous gift" is
given silently.

At United Church we
have adopted this
beautiful idea this
year as our Advent
theme. The many
demands of the holiday
season can push us to
feel challenged and
stressed at a time of year that ought to be peaceful
and joyful. We need to remind ourselves that the
essence of Advent and Christmas is best expressed
in the divine love that centuries ago came to us in a
baby born in the stillness of the night in an unknown
place to unknown parents.



ONLINE CHURCH DIRECTORY

Also, to stay up-to-date and current, you can access our church's online directory at www.unitedchurch.org.

The online directory comes directly from our church database and is updated on a regular basis. You do need to create an account to use the directory.

If you don't have an account already, please read the steps below on how to access the church's online directory.

- Go to www.unitedchurch.org and click "Church Directory" at the very top of our websites' homepage to go to the "Sign In" screen.
- Underneath the "Sign in" box it says "Need a login? Click here" You need to make an account to log in. Click on it to take you to the "Account Sign Up" box to register as a directory user.
- Type in your email address, your first name, your last name. Important note: this information has to match what we have in our church database.
- Hit the "Find Me" button.
- "Access ACS" (our on-line directory) will send you a temporary password.
- Immediately getting your temporary password you should then: Go back to the first "Sign In" screen, then type your email or username (first and last name, no spaces).
- Type the temporary password (or cut and paste it) into the first sign in screen.
- Once you are logged into the directory, you will be asked to create your own password for the directory.

Following these steps, you should be able to access the online directory. If you are having problems, please call the church office during office hours for assistance.

Undivided Attention

*"Beware, keep alert; for you do not know
when the time will come."*

My daughter is two-and-a-half and still not talking much. To ease her frustration we've taught her signs for words like "milk" and "clean up," and she's created her own signs for the things she really wants, like "music" and "animal crackers."

Nonverbal communication is more demanding than speech. I can't passively listen to her while focusing on something else, and she knows it.

When she has something to say and my head is turned away from her in conversation with someone else or in communication with my iPhone, she places her hand on my cheek and steers my face toward hers until she knows she has my undivided attention.

God's Beloved Community, too, requires our focus. We've been given work to do in this interim time - the work of justice and peace - and it won't accept less than our all.

Advent is a season for having our gaze gently but firmly redirected. A time to abandon all the shiny distractions that have turned our heads. A call to give our undivided attention to the one who is arriving any minute now, the one who has something vitally important to communicate to us, the one who will not be ignored.

Summary of the Council Meeting November 28, 2017

Financial Update:

- Treasurer, Derek Harrison, gave an update on the 2018 budget plans based on the recent listening sessions with the congregation. There are several options to be considered. The Trustees meet 12/4 to finalize the budget. Council will meet 12/5 to approve it prior to the Congregational Meeting on 12/10.
- The 2017 budget forecast is that revenue will fall \$30,00 short of expenses.

Board updates:

- Children's: Many fun activities
- Youth: Recent Youth Service was a great success. 50-60 youth participated. In January they will attend a Conference Youth retreat in Boone.
- Deacons: Reviewing how to balance budget constraints and the desire to be inclusive of non-English speakers.
- Fellowship: Popcorn sale at Alternative Market raised about \$200. Will put a hold on their request for a new freezer due to the budget issues.
- Adult: Working on a series on mental health. Exploring more creative adult forums. Planning Light Up Your Winter.
- BJOS: Working on the budget and prioritizing giving. Working on Creation Justice theme for Winter series.
- MES: 248 pledges received resulting in \$670K or 77% of goal.
- Trustees: Working on 2018 budget.
