SCRIPTURE READINGS Proverbs 4:1-13 (A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church) Listen, children, to the instruction of a parent, and be attentive to know understanding. For I give you good instruction; do not forsake my teaching. I was still a child with my father, and my mother's only [child]. And I was taught, and it was said to me, "Let your heart hold fast my words; keep my commandments and you shall live. Acquire wisdom, acquire understanding: Do not forget, nor turn away from the words of my mouth. Do not forsake her, and she will keep you; love her, and she will preserve you. The beginning of wisdom is this: Acquire wisdom, and whatever else you acquire, acquire insight. Esteem her and she will exalt you; she will honor you if you embrace her. She will place on your head a graceful garland; she will present to you a glorious crown." Hear my child and receive my words, that the years of your life may be many. In the way of wisdom have I taught you; I have led you in the paths of uprightness. When you walk, your step will not be hindered; and when you run, you will not stumble. Hold fast to instruction; do not let go; guard her, for she is your life.

Now Jesus went out again beside the sea and the whole crowd gathered around him and he taught them. And as he was walking along he saw Levi son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him.

Then as Jesus reclined to eat in Levi's house, many tax collectors and sinners were also reclining to eat with Jesus and his disciples, for there were many who followed him. Now when the biblical scholars among the Pharisees saw that Jesus was eating with sinners and tax collectors, they said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?" And when Jesus heard this, he said to them, "The women and men who are well have no need of a physician, rather those who are sick do; not to call the righteous have I come but rather sinners."

Now John's disciples and the Pharisees were fasting and people came and said to Jesus, "Why do John's disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?" And Jesus said to them, "The attendants of the bridal chamber cannot fast while the bridegroom is with them, can they? As long as they have the bridegroom with them, they cannot fast. Yet the days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them and then they will fast on that day. No one sews a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old garment lest the patch pulls away from it, the new from the old, and a worse tear is formed. And no one puts new wine into old wineskins lest the wine burst the skins and the wine is lost with the wineskins rather, one puts new wine into fresh wineskins."

Now it was that Jesus was going through the grainfields on the sabbath and as his disciples began the path, they were plucking heads of grain. Then the Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not permissible on the sabbath?" And Jesus said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he was in need and hungry and his companions along with him? How he entered the house of God when Abiathar was high priest and ate the bread of the Presence which it is not permissible for any but the priests to eat, and gave some to his companions?" Then Jesus said to them, "The sabbath was made for the woman-born and not the woman-born for the sabbath. Thus the Woman-Born Son is sovereign, even of the sabbath."

This is the word of God for the people of God. Thanks be to God.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH Selections from our Racial Justice Covenant, adopted 2016

Trusting in the grace of God that overflows with faith and love,

we acknowledge that we have constructed and sustained the false concept of race, with systemic racism embedded in our nation, institutions, and selves. Therefore, we seek to transform ourselves, our church, and our world.

Recognizing that God shows no partiality and made us all of one blood,

we confess that we use race to advantage some and disadvantage others, focus on individual prejudice rather than on unjust systems, perpetuate the oppression, legacy, and effects of racism through our indifference or complicity, and deny that overcoming racism is a spiritual struggle. Therefore, we recognize our need to be forgiven and to forgive.

As Jesus did not count equality with God as something to be exploited but humbled himself, we commit to listen, learn, and walk in humility to better understand and repair the evils of racism. As we journey together, there is no one to whom we can say, 'we have no need of you.'




