We come to worship, and the star sheds light on our lives.


The magi brought gifts to offer the child.

We too bring gifts: ourselves, our hopes, and our commitments to our community. Shepherds and magi - the poor and the powerful - all were welcome in Bethlehem.


We too have come to the cradle of the Christchild. As witnesses to the love of God incarnate, we shine the light of Christ for all the world to see.







Micah has a Master of Divinity in Pastoral Care and Counseling from Campbell Divinity School, and has been serving in ordained ministry in various contexts for over 20 years. Micah currently serves as hospice chaplain with Transitions LifeCare, where he has served as a chaplain since 2014.

Though not currently serving in a church, Micah has served as pastor in a number of churches over the years, most recently at Life's Journey UCC of Burlington, and before that at Hanks Chapel UCC of Pittsboro.

Micah has previously served as President of the Eastern NC Association of the United Church of Christ and was a founding board member of LILA Latinx LGBTA Initiative.

Micah is passionate about widening the circle of welcome in the church to make room for all kinds of people, especially the often overlooked and forgotten by the world, as well as working in our community and the world around us to better make room for all kinds of people to discover a "broad place in which no cramping" for themselves and their families (Psalm 18:19; 31:8).

BIO: Rev. Raymond Wise, Ph. D., a native of Baltimore, Md., began his musical career at the age of three, singing gospel music with his family singing group "The Wise Singers." Professor Wise earned a B.F.A. in Music from Denison University (Granville, Ohio). He did additional studies in Opera, Art, and German at the Institute for European Studies in Vienna, Austria, and in African-American History, Music, and Dance at San Francisco State University in San Francisco, California. Wise currently serves on the faculty of Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana, where he serves as Professor of Practice in the African American African Diaspora Studies department and instructs courses in African American music.

He is the associate director of the African American Arts Institute, an IU division devoted to the perpetuation and performance of African American music and art. Professor Wise is an ordained minister and has served as a church musician for more than 40 years. Wise has penned more than 600 compositions.

Wise is founder and president of Raise Productions' Center for the Gospel Arts, a gospel music production and publishing company in Columbus, Ohio, established to provide educational training and resources for gospel artists and the community. His knowledge of both the gospel and classical music genre has enabled him to serve as a consultant and clinician in academic and gospel music settings. Wise is known for helping choirs perform gospel music authentically. He currently serves as the Ethnic and American music Repertoire and Standards Chair for the American Choral Director's Association Central Division.

Wise also wrote and conducted the documentary concert film *Amen! Music of the Black Church* about the traditions, historical significance and meaning of the Black church music. The film earned national and regional awards and aired on PBS stations across the United States.
