We are called to love God with our whole heart, soul, strength, and mind, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. There is no greater law than this.



Confirmation Statement of Faith


We believe that God is good, a higher power that guides us, a manifestation of hope in which we can believe, a leap of faith, and a loving entity that helps people feel safe and secure.


