UNITED CHURCH OF CHAPEL HILL NEGRO SPIRITUALS ROYALTIES PROJECT

The Negro Spirituals Royalties Projects is pleased to announce a new recipient of our donations, the choir **100 Men in Black**.

100 Men in Black brings together men and boys of all age groups, ethnicities and walks of life who love to sing and share the good news of the gospel through music. This choir, under the direction of founder Marlon E. West in Durham, N.C., is an independent, community-based male chorus with membership open to all within the Triangle community and surrounding areas. Its mission statement is:

To provide proactive positive alternatives to youth and adult males through music, faith, community service, positive role modeling and mentoring.

Among its stated goals, 100 Men in Black seeks to foster Christian fellowship and camaraderie through music, to provide community outreach to those who are imprisoned and homeless, to serve as role models and mentors to young males, particularly "at-risk" youth, to offer an alternative to gang violence and drugs, and to foster cultural exchange and understanding.

We recognize that we are beneficiaries of the rich heritage of music that is the Negro Spiritual, that body of work that was born from enslaved peoples, and whose creators remain unnamed and uncompensated. Each time we are uplifted in worship by a Negro Spiritual or a composition inspired by a Negro Spiritual, the congregation is invited to give an offering in lieu of the church paying royalties for the use of this music. The funds collected are given to an organization that seeks to further the music education of under-served communities of young people, particularly descendants of those who created this body of literature. The steering committee of the NSRP is confident that 100 Men in Black will be a worthy recipient of these funds and will use them for the purpose intended.

This morning in our service celebrating Juneteenth we share many Spirituals and compositions inspired by Spirituals. You are invited to give a significant gift to launch the new year of the Negro Spirituals Royalties Project, and to celebrate this new community partnership with 100 Men in Black.
