This year's recipients are **Kathryn Kilgallen** of Chapel Hill High School (CHHS), **Cole Nicholson** of Carrboro High School (CHS), and **Lindsay White** of East Chapel Hill High School (ECHHS).



Kathryn Kilgallen currently attends Chapel Hill High School while also enrolled in online courses through the NC School of Science and Math. She is the president of SAVE, or Students Against Violence Everywhere, and has found creative ways to engage her fellow students and heighten awareness. SAVE grew from 20 to 75 members under her leadership, including outreach initiatives in conjunction with Sandy Hook Promise. Kathryn will attend The College of William & Mary in the fall. Her future plans include pursuing a career in health policy, including addressing disparities in care and advocating for victims through legal means.



Cole Nicholson is a member of the US Youth Ambassadors Program and is the current president of the Carrboro High School Model UN Club. As a fluent Spanish speaker and a member of the Newcomers Math Club he tutors non-English speakers, and has been active in translating forms for fellow students that help them overcome barriers to athletic participation. Lindsay White of East Chapel Hill High School has been active in their Social Justice Program since Freshman year.
